Everything else is available either on the app for Android and Apple tablets/smart-phones or downloadable in a searchable pdf format for PCs. I would like to thank Neeraj Bhasin, Consultant Vascular Surgeon in Huddersfield, and Hashem Barakat, Affiliate Member from Hull who will be running our twitter and text feeds during the meeting. I would also like to thank our new secretariat: Elaine Hall and Caroline Kumedzina, plus the staff from our conference organiser Fitwise, for all their hard work in contributing to the success of this meeting.

The Annual Dinner will be held at the Old Fruitmarket on Thursday 27th November, with a Ceilidh band followed by a disco until midnight. If you haven't bought tickets yet then do so quickly as this promises to be a fantastic evening. A Civic Reception will be held at the Glasgow Science Centre just over the footbridge on Wednesday 26th November immediately following the close of the Scientific Meeting.
